










Homecoming 2024

Zucchini Bread

3 cups all-purpose flour

1 teaspoon salt

1 teaspoon baking powder

1 teaspoon baking soda

1 tablespoon ground cinnamon

3 large eggs

1 cup vegetable oil

2 1/4 cups white sugar

3 teaspoons vanilla extract

2 cups grated zucchini

1 cup chopped walnuts

The prep time on the bread will be around 15 min and bake time is 40 min. This recipe will make 24 servings for you and your family to enjoy.

Step 1 – Gather all ingredients. Preheat the oven to 325 degrees F (165 degrees C). Grease and flour two 8x4-inch pans.

Step 2-Sift flour, salt, baking powder, baking soda, and cinnamon together in a large bowl.

Step 3 – Beat eggs, oil, sugar, and vanilla together in a separate large bowl with an electric mixer until combined; add flour mixture and beat well.

Step 4-Stir in zucchini and walnuts until well combined.

Step 5-Pour batter into the prepared pans.

Step 6 - Bake in the preheated oven until a toothpick inserted into the center comes out clean, about 40 to 60 minutes. Cool in the pans on a wire rack for 20 minutes.

Step 7 -Run a table knife around the edges to loosen. Invert carefully onto a wire rack and let cool completely.

3-Ingredient Peanut Butter Cookies

1 cup peanut butter

1 cup white sugar



1 large egg

This will give you enough for 24 servings and with a prep time of 15 minutes and cook time of only 10 your cookies will be ready to eat in no time.

Step One

Gather all ingredients. Preheat the oven to 350 degrees F (175 degrees C).

Step Two

Mix peanut butter, sugar, and egg together in a bowl using an electric mixer until smooth and creamy.

Step 3

Roll mixture into 1-inch balls and place 1 inch apart on an ungreased baking sheet.

Step 4

Flatten each with a fork, making a criss-cross pattern. Bake in the preheated oven until edges are firm, about 10 minutes. Cool on the baking sheet briefly before removing to a wire rack to cool completely.
