































Carbondale Area Drama Club Presents: Annie Junior!

Top 5 Super Bowl Snacks



Ingredients: 1/2 cup all-purpose flour, 1/4 teaspoon ground paprika, 1/4 teaspoon cayenne pepper, 1/4 teaspoon salt, 10 chicken wings, 2 cups vegetable oil for frying (or as needed), 1/4 cup butter, 1/4 cup hot sauce, 1 pinch ground black pepper, 1 pinch garlic powder, **Directions**: Mix the dry coating: In a large bowl, whisk together the flour, paprika, cayenne pepper, and salt. **Coat the wings**: Add the chicken wings to the bowl and toss until evenly coated with the flour mixture. **Chill the wings**: Arrange the coated wings in a single layer in a 9" x 13" glass baking dish. Cover and refrigerate for 1 to 1 1/2 hours. **Prepare the oil**: Add about 1 inch of vegetable oil to a deep, heavy skillet. Heat to 375°F (190°C). **Make the sauce**: While the oil is heating, combine the butter, hot sauce, black pepper, and garlic powder in a small saucepan over low heat. Cook and stir until the butter is melted and the mixture is well blended. Remove from heat and set aside. **Fry the wings**: Carefully place the wings into the hot oil and fry for 10 to 15 minutes, or until they are crispy and golden brown. Maintain a steady oil temperature during frying. **Drain the wings**: Remove the wings from the oil and place them on paper towels or a wire rack to drain any excess oil. Serve and enjoy! Drizzle or toss the wings in the warm sauce before serving.

Burger Sliders



Ingredients: Cooking spray, 2 pounds ground beef, 1 (1.25-ounce) envelope onion soup mix, 2 cups shredded Cheddar cheese, 1/2 cup mayonnaise, 24 dinner rolls, split, 1/2 cup sliced pickles (optional), **Directions**: Preheat the oven to 350°F (175°C). Cover a baking sheet with aluminum foil and lightly coat with cooking spray. Grease an additional sheet of aluminum foil and set it aside. **Cook the beef**: In a large skillet, mix together the ground beef and onion soup mix. Cook over medium-high heat, stirring frequently, until the beef is browned and crumbly, about 5 to 7 minutes. Drain and discard any excess grease. **Make the filling**: Remove the skillet from the heat. Stir in the shredded Cheddar cheese and mayonnaise until well combined. Assemble the sliders: Place the bottom halves of the dinner rolls on the prepared baking sheet. Spoon the beef mixture evenly over each roll, then top with the remaining roll halves. **Bake**: Cover the sliders with the greased sheet of foil. Bake in the preheated oven for about 30 minutes, or until the sliders are heated through and the cheese is melted. **Serve**: Serve warm with sliced pickles, if desired. Enjoy!

Buffalo Chicken Dip



Ingredients: 2 (10-ounce) cans chunk chicken, drained, 3/4 cup hot pepper sauce (such as Frank's Red Hot), 2 (8-ounce) packages cream cheese, softened, 1 cup Ranch Dressing, 11/2 cups shredded Cheddar cheese, Directions: Heat the chicken and hot sauce in a skillet over medium heat, combine the chicken and hot pepper sauce. Cook until heated through, about 3 to 5 minutes., Stir in the cream cheese and ranch dressing. Continue to cook, stirring frequently, until the mixture is well blended and warm, about 3 to 5 minutes. Mix in half of the shredded Cheddar cheese. Transfer the mixture to a slow cooker. Sprinkle the remaining Cheddar cheese on top. Cover and cook on Low until the dip is hot and bubbly, about 35 minutes. Once heated through and melted, the dip is ready to be served. Best enjoyed warm with chips, crackers, or celery sticks.

NACHOS



Ingredients: Aluminum foil, 1 pound ground beef ,3/4 cup water, 1 (1.25-ounce) package taco seasoning mix, 1 (18-ounce) package restaurant-style tortilla chips, 1 cup shredded sharp Cheddar cheese (or more, to taste), 1 (15.5-ounce) can refried beans, 1 (10-ounce) can pitted black olives, drained and chopped, 1 cup salsa, 1 cup sour cream (or more, to taste), 4 green onions, diced, 1 (4-ounce) can sliced jalapeño peppers, drained Directions: Preheat the broiler. Set the oven rack about 6 inches from the heat source. Line a baking sheet with aluminum foil. Cook the beef in a skillet over medium heat, cook and stir the ground beef until it's browned and crumbly, about 5–10 minutes. Drain any excess grease. Season the meat. Stir in the water and taco seasoning mix. Simmer until thickened, about 8–10 minutes. Assemble the nachos. Spread the tortilla chips on the prepared baking sheet. Top with shredded Cheddar cheese, refried beans, and the ground beef mixture. Broil the nachos. Place under the broiler for 3–5 minutes, or until the cheese is melted and bubbly. Add toppings. Sprinkle with olives, salsa, sour cream, green onions, and jalapeños. Serve and enjoy! Best enjoyed fresh out of the oven.

FOOTBALL BROWNIES



Ingredients:1 box brownie mix (plus ingredients called for on the box), 1/3 cup heavy cream, 1 cup semisweet chocolate chips, 2/3 cup powdered sugar, 3 1/2 teaspoons milk **Directions**: Preheat the oven to 350°F. Line a 9" x 13" baking pan with parchment paper. Prepare the brownie mix according to package instructions. Bake for 20 to 23 minutes, or until a toothpick inserted into the center comes out clean. Let the brownies cool completely. Cut out football shapes from the baked brownies and place them on a cooling rack set over a baking sheet. **Make the ganache**: Place the chocolate chips in a heatproof bowl. Microwave the cream until hot, about 40 seconds, and pour it over the chocolate. Let sit for 3 minutes. Then, stir until smooth and creamy with no lumps. Dip the brownies into the ganache, covering the tops completely. Place them in the refrigerator to set for 30 minutes. **Make the icing:** In a small bowl, mix together the powdered sugar and milk until smooth. Transfer the icing to a piping bag (or a resealable plastic bag with a tiny corner snipped off). Decorate the brownies with icing to resemble football laces. Return them to the refrigerator to set for another 5 minutes. **ENJOY!** They are a **TOUCHDOWN!**

Super Bowl LIX was an American football championship game played to determine the champion of the National Football League for the 2024 season. In a rematch of Super Bowl LVII two years prior, the National Football Conference (NFC) champion

Philadelphia Eagles defeated the American Football Conference (AFC) champion Kansas

City Chiefs 40–22, securing their first Super Bowl championship since Super Bowl LII seven years earlier, and second overall. Eagles quarterback Jalen Hurts, who scored three touchdowns 2 passing, 1 rushing, completed 17 of 22 attempts for 221 yards, and set the Super Bowl record for quarterback rushing yards with 72, was named Super Bowl MVP.


But in the end it was the Eagles defense that came up big for them allowing only 23 total first half yards.
















allowing teams to acquire new talent and reshape their rosters. This event typically begins in March, following the conclusion of the NFL regular season and the Super Bowl. During free agency, players whose contracts have expired or who have been released by their teams become available to negotiate with any franchise. This process is crucial for teams looking to improve their performance, fill gaps in their lineups, and build a competitive roster for the upcoming season. The impact of free agency on the NFL cannot be overstated. For players, it represents an opportunity to secure lucrative contracts and find a team that fits their skills and aspirations. High profile free agents often generate significant media attention, as fans and analysts speculate about where they might land. Teams that are aggressive in free agency can quickly transform their fortunes. For example, a franchise that struggles the previous season may sign a few key players, significantly improving its chances of success the following year. The balance of power in the league can shift dramatically in just a few days during this period. However, free agency also comes with its challenges. Teams must navigate salary cap constraints, ensuring they do not overspend on players while maintaining financial flexibility for future seasons. Additionally, not all free agent signings pan out as expected; injuries, poor fit within a team's system, or simply under performance can lead to disappointment. Thus, while free agency offers a chance for teams to enhance

their rosters, it requires careful planning and execution to achieve the desired outcomes. As the NFL continues to evolve, free agency remains a critical component of team building strategies and a key element of the league's competitive landscape.



MLB SPRING TRAINING

SPRING TRAINING

Major League Baseball's spring training is in full gear, bringing fresh energy—and some fresh rules—to diamonds across Florida and Arizona. With exhibition games underway, fans are not only evaluating their favorite players but also adjusting to one of the most significant rule changes in years: a newly defined strike zone.


In an effort to improve consistency and pace of play, MLB has implemented an automated ball-strike (ABS) system in all spring training games. The rule adjusts the strike zone to a standardized height from the batter's knees to the midpoint of their torso — and removes the subjectivity of umpire calls behind the plate.






This rule will be further tested throughout spring training and may be adopted league-wide if proven effective. The ABS system is just one part of MLB's broader initiative to modernize the game and attract younger audiences.

Meanwhile, the usual excitement of spring training is still front and center. New stars, including high-profile offseason acquisitions and top minor league prospects, are taking the field. With rosters still in flux, every pitch, swing, and out counts.



The regular season begins April 1, but for now, fans are soaking up the sun — and the new strike zone — in what promises to be a dynamic start to the 2025 campaign.

becoming the first player in
history to pull off a
three-peat in the event.
McClung took down Spurs
rookie Stephon Castle in the
finals.

The 2025 NBA All Star Championship was an all star single elimination basketball tournament played on February 16, 2025, during the National Basketball Association's 2024–25 season. It was the 74th edition of the NBA All Star Game. It was hosted by the Golden State Warriors at Chase Center. It was the fourth time the Warriors hosted the game and the first time since 2000, when the NBA All Star game was played at the Oakland Arena in Oakland, California. The Warriors also hosted the game in 1960, as the Philadelphia Warriors at the Convention Hall in Philadelphia and in 1967, as the San Francisco Warriors at the Cow Palace in Daly City. This was the first time that the NBA All Star Game was held in San Francisco. The All Star Game was televised nationally by TNT for the 23rd and final consecutive year, before returning to NBC (which aired the game for 11 years prior to TNT taking over coverage) in the next season.

The All Star championship itself consisted of a four team single elimination tournament as two semifinals and a championship game, similar to the most recent NHL All Star Games and Rising Stars Challenges. Three teams were drafted from a pool of twenty four selected all stars by NBA on TNT analysts Shaquille O'Neal, Kenny Smith, and Charles Barkley, while Candace Parker, also a TNT analyst, managed the winning team from the Rising Stars Challenge (which has used a four team tournament since 2022). Shaq's OGs defeated Chuck's Global Stars to win the tournament. Stephen Curry was named the All Star Most Valuable Player.

symbolism.







The Great Gatsby

his time in the Jazz Age."




